CODE OF CONDUCT

Grande Prairie Public Library patrons and staff are entitled to a welcoming and pleasant environment in which to use GPPL's services and facilities. To ensure enjoyment of the library for all visitors, the following rules must be followed:

Respect others

- Be considerate of others in GPPL spaces and respectfully coexist
- Take responsibility for those in your care during your visit
- Follow the directions of library staff

Some behaviours are unacceptable and may result in the suspension or restriction of library privileges, including banning from the premises. Criminal offences may result in prosecution. Unacceptable behaviours include:

- Abuse, discrimination, or harassment of any kind towards others
- Using intoxicating substances
- Begging or selling services, goods, or merchandise
- Carrying or using a weapon
- Sexual activity
- Damaging or stealing GPPL property
- Distributing or posting materials without permission from GPPL staff
- Violation of GPPL agreements, guidelines, or policies

In addition to the above unacceptable behaviours, the following rules must be respected:

Sleeping

• Sleeping is not permitted in the library due to health and safety concerns.

Personal Effects

• Patrons must respect the library's space and keep their personal effects (i.e. bags, carts, etc.) limited and on their person at all times.

Animals

Only registered service animals are allowed in the library.

Phones and other devices

Personal electronic devices must be used in a manner that does not disturb others.

Clothing

• Upper and lower body clothing and footwear must be worn.

Food and drink

No food or drink is permitted while operating GPPL's gaming computers or the Creative Stations.

Sports equipment

• Sports equipment must not be used inside the library.

Public access computers

Library computers must not be used to:

- Access sites or transmit materials that violate federal or provincial laws or municipal bylaws
- Display overt sexual images
- Damage or modify GPPL's computer equipment, software, or network

GPPL reserves the right to terminate a computer session at any time.

Violation of any of the above rules may result in suspension or restriction of library privileges, including banning from library premises. Criminal offences may result in prosecution.
